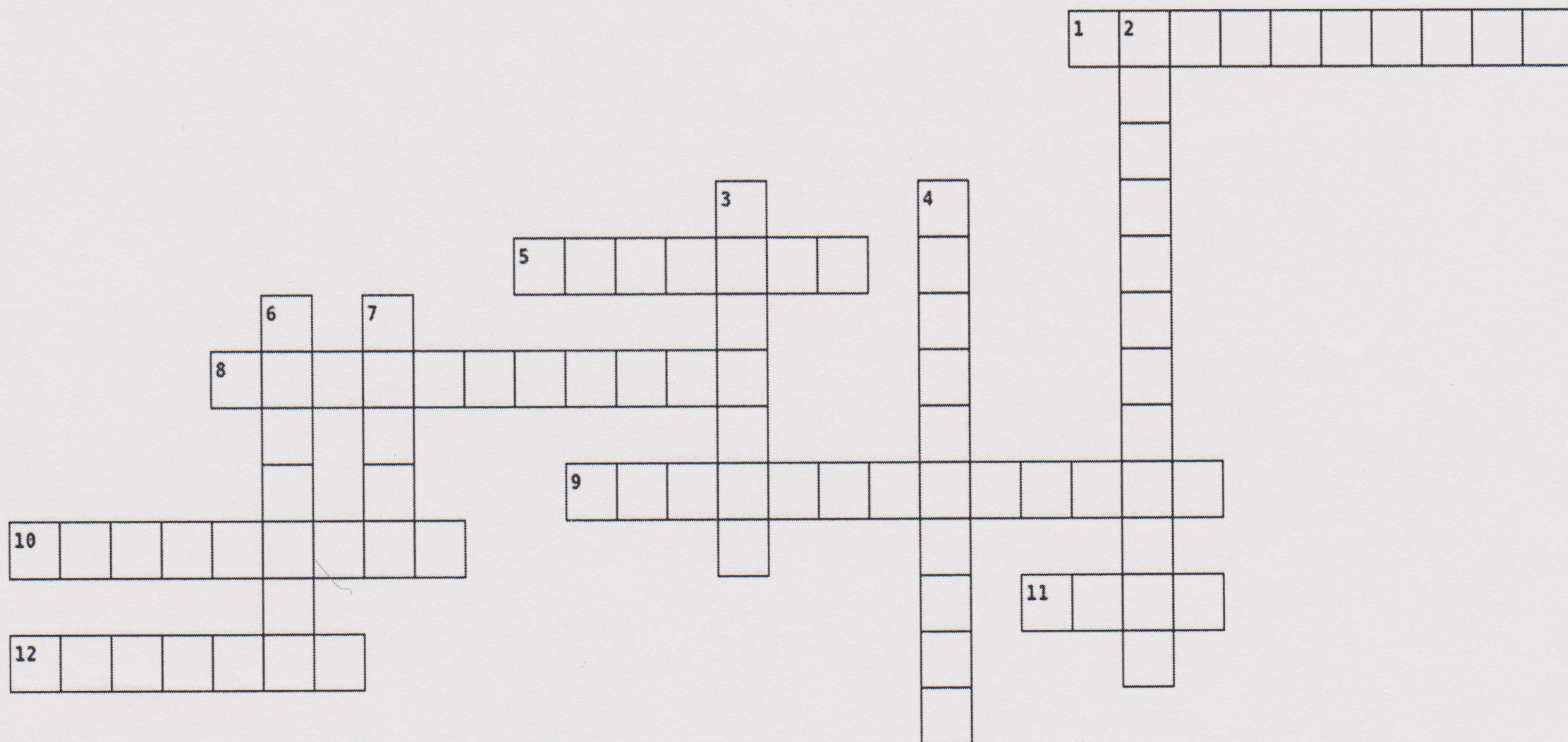


Do you even "CLTM"?

1. Pattern most prominent between 24- and 36-weeks PMA and consists of 0.3 to 1.5Hz slow waves with superimposed fast activity.
5. 6-11Hz activity, temporal maximum, seen in drowsiness or light sleep.
8. Located in the temporal lobe. Responsible for memory and learning.
9. Tumor of childhood, derived from primitive ganglion cells.
10. Delta Brushes have also been described as these complexes.
11. During this test, one side of the brain is "put to sleep" using sodium amobarbital.
12. In general, as metabolic encephalopathies intensify, amplitude increases while the background exhibits what?

2. Drug of choice for Absence seizures.
3. Type of focal seizures associated with tingling or numbness, visual symptoms, sounds, olfactory, or gustatory symptoms, vertigo, and possible hot or cold feelings.
4. Formerly known as simple partial seizures.
6. Minimal number of simultaneously recording EEG channels.
7. Only imaging technique useful for determining seizure focus.
